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MAAO Profile - Cindy Namer



Well, it' my 1-year anniversary of being a member of the Maine MAAO Board and that means it is finally time for me to do my member profile! I'm actually glad I waited until now because my first year has been an experience of listening and learning, similar to my encounters with all of the other

assessors that have taken the time over the past few years to provide me with guidance and assistance as I have learned "how to be a good assessor". I actually have to thank Vern Zeigler, a longtime family friend, for getting me involved in the assessing world.


In 1989 I began my career in the public sector working for Maine State Housing Authority that lasted 30 years. I started working in the multi-family division, as a program compliance assistant and over the years transitioned to risk assessment, supported housing projects and tax-credit development and finally ending with the Director of Homeless Initiatives for the entire state. It was a very rewarding career but after 30 years of state and federal government, it was time for me to make a change....don't ask me why Vern talked me into assessing, but I'm glad he did. Before working at the state housing authority. I also worked as a paralegal and title searcher, real estate agent and even held a position as a Selectperson in my small town of Bowdoin, where we were both selectmen and assessors. So, with encouragement from Vern, I signed up for Maine Revenue Tax School in August 2019, attended classes all week and took the test, passing on the first try, and there my assessing story begins.....

Instead of going right back to the 8-5, five-day work week, I decided to take the consulting path and Shining Star Enterprises, LLC was established. I immediately connected with many of the local assessing groups, Central Maine Assessing, Mid-coast Maine Assessing, etc., where I meet some of the best assessors and mentors that welcomed me and guided me through the challenges of being an assessing agent. I landed my first contact with Vision doing field work for a revaluation but that was cut short with a few months when COVID-19 was in full swing. I finally landed my first assessing gig when the Town of Paris accepted my RFP for assessing agent services in July of 2021. I am starting my 4th year with Paris as my primary client, but I have also recently worked with the Town of Bowdoin and Bowdoinham over the last year as they transition to filing their Assessor positions. It seems that all of these assignments have been an opportunity for me to step in and help them re-invent and re-organize the Assessor's office, since all of these towns had long standing assessors (most of them were also Code Enforcement Officers) and were in need of an Assessor with a new style and project management approach. So, it's been fun to see the transformation, especially in light of all the new changes for assessing.

With my background in public service, I guess it has been natural for me to want to work closely with the taxpayers and help them understand the role of the Assessor....I'm not the bad guy, but here to help them and make sure their property is assessed appropriately and fairly. With the real estate market craziness, I actually had to do a market adjustment during my first Tax Commitment and I made sure that the what, when, how and why's were communicated to all parties involved, which ended up more successful than anticipated. That said, I won't be retiring from my new as-

sessing career anytime soon.

In the meantime. I will continue to reside in Bowdoin with my precious 3-legged rescue girl Zoie and my partner Scott. I enjoy spending lots of time at the lake in the summer and travelling to my condo in Florida for an extended stay in November/ December. I have lived in Maine my entire life growing up in Waterville and later living in the Portland area before building my home in Bowdoin. I hold an Associates Degree in Paralegal Studies and a Bachelor's Degree in Business and Public Administration from the University of Maine, as well as various Certifications in Leadership **Development and Project** Management.

MAINE ASSOCIATION OF ASSESSING OFFICERS ASSESSOR OF THE YEAR AWARD

The Award

The Assessor of the Year Award is sponsored annually by the Maine Association of Assessing Officers Association (MAAO) to recognize professional and dedicated service by an Assessor to his/her profession and community.

Nominating Process/Presentation of Award:

- The selection committee shall be appointed by the MAAO Board of Directors. It may consist of the following:
 - The Chair of the Awards and Scholarship Committee, the Awards and Scholarship Committee members and the MAAO Executive Board members.
 - Immediate past recipient of the Assessor of the Year award.
- The Committee shall solicit nominations from MAAO members and affiliates.
 Deadline for nominations to be submitted will be August 09, 2024.
 Nominations will be submitted on the official MAAO Assessor of the Year Nomination Form.
- 3) The Committee shall not disclose the name of the recipient before the Awards Ceremony.
- 4 The Award will be given during the MAAO Fall Conference Annual meeting in September.

Criteria:

Nominees for this award shall meet the following criteria:

- Nominee must hold the title of Assessor for his/her municipality and be a current CMA.
- 2) Nominee provides service and contribution beyond just that of the municipality in which he/she serves by active participation in various Assessing organizations.
- 3) Quality and consistency of work product
- 4) Nominee is recognized as an Assessor who displays characteristics of integrity and leadership.
- 5) Nominee shall have at least three years experience as an Assessor.
- 6) Nominee is not eligible if they have been a previous recipient of the Assessor of the Year Award.

MAAO Scholarship Eligibility Requirements

Applicants must:

- 1. Be a current member of MAAO and in good standing.
- 2. Demonstrate a need for academic and financial assistance.
- 3. Submit the required application form to be received by the Scholarship Education Committee Chair 60 days prior to the event you plan on using the scholarship for. Applications will not be accepted if not received by the deadline.

Scholarship Conditions:

- 1. Scholarship recipients are ineligible to apply for another award for three (3) years Unless no other applications have been received and/or monies are available. This decision will be left to the discretion of the Board.
- 2. Must apply timely and on appropriate form to be considered for the present year.
- 3. Use the scholarship by 12/31 of each year.
- 4. Shall write a summary stating length of time in assessing field.
- 5. Qualifying educational course work is defined as granting a minimum of 16 hours assessment by which a letter or certificate of completion can demonstrate examination success and the assignment of full credit. Continuing Education Units for licensure renewal other than Certified Maine Assessor and Certified Assessing Technician do not meet the scholarship conditions.
- 6. Successful applicants who subsequently decline the scholarship must reapply for future consideration.
- 7. Applicants must certify that no other tuition or course materials reimbursements has been awarded, nor will be sought, from any other source (e.g., county, state, local jurisdiction, or other educational or professional body), unless the scholarship does not fully cover the entire amount of the course and will receive the balance.
- 8. An application must be submitted with an original signature.
- 9. The name of the school or sponsoring organization must be submitted with the scholarship application.
- 10. Applicants are limited to one application per calendar year.
- 11. Only one (1) scholarship to be given to an Individual every three (3) years. Unless no other applications have been received and/or monies are available. This decision will be left to the discretion of the Board.
- 12. The MAAO Board reserves the right to reject or accept courses that are acceptable for the scholarship.

Reimbursement will cover only up to the amount of the registration fee(s).

IAAO courses, State related courses, and other related subjects pertaining to the assessment field in general including State, MAAO, NRAAO and IAAO conferences are accepted courses.
